

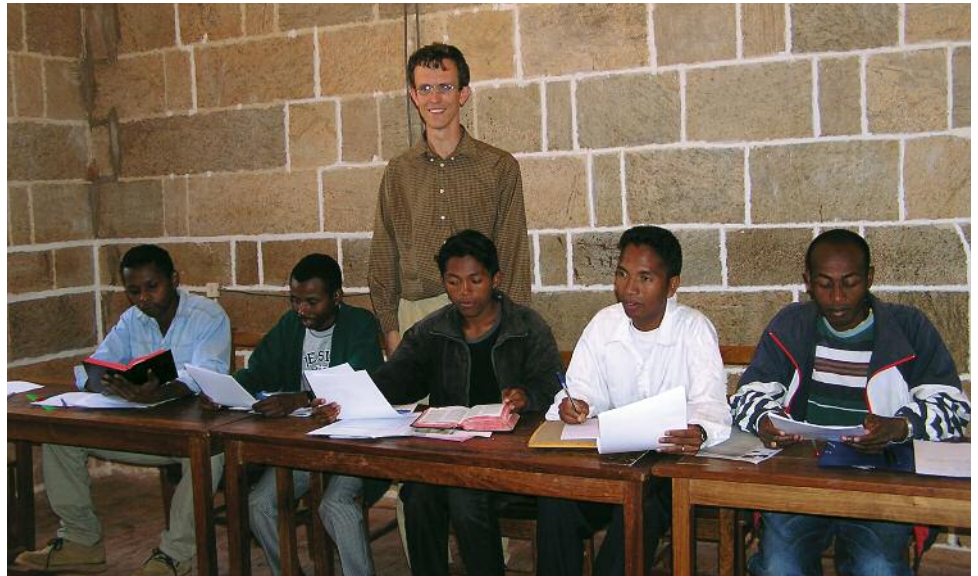

The Anglican Church in Madagascar desperately needs more trained clergy and lay leaders. At present there are only 100 Anglican priests in the country – many aged 70 or over – each with as many as six parishes to look after. Parishes without clergy and trained leaders struggle to respond effectively to the needs of the community around them. St Paul's Theological College in the Diocese of Antananarivo is training mainly young men to be effective ministers to preach the gospel and serve their communities. USPG is committed to holistic ministry in

Madagascar and that means catering for the spiritual as well as physical needs. Each year, the college equips Malagasy students with the tools they need to help people in their faith. Many priests in Madagascar are proclaiming the gospel under difficult circumstances with commitment and enthusiasm. Your support will give the church an opportunity to invest in this ministry. The work of the college is also supported by USPG Mission Companion Sam Beeton, who teaches church history, Greek and English.
