Even in today’s globalised world, many places remain untouched by the gospel – simply because there is no-one to proclaim it. In parts of the Anglican Communion, where the church is growing rapidly, there is an urgent need for clergy and lay leaders to disciple new believers. Churches that are equipped with trained leaders are able to respond effectively to the needs of the community around them. This is certainly the case in many parts of Southern Africa, where the church is the cornerstone of the

community – the means through which healthcare and education are made available. The Diocese of St Mark the Evangelist, in South Africa, is desperate to expand its ministry, but it lacks trained leaders and evangelists to do so. However, with the help of a grant from USPG, the diocese will be able recruit students and train them in theology, leadership and community development. These students will become the future leaders in parishes across the diocese.
