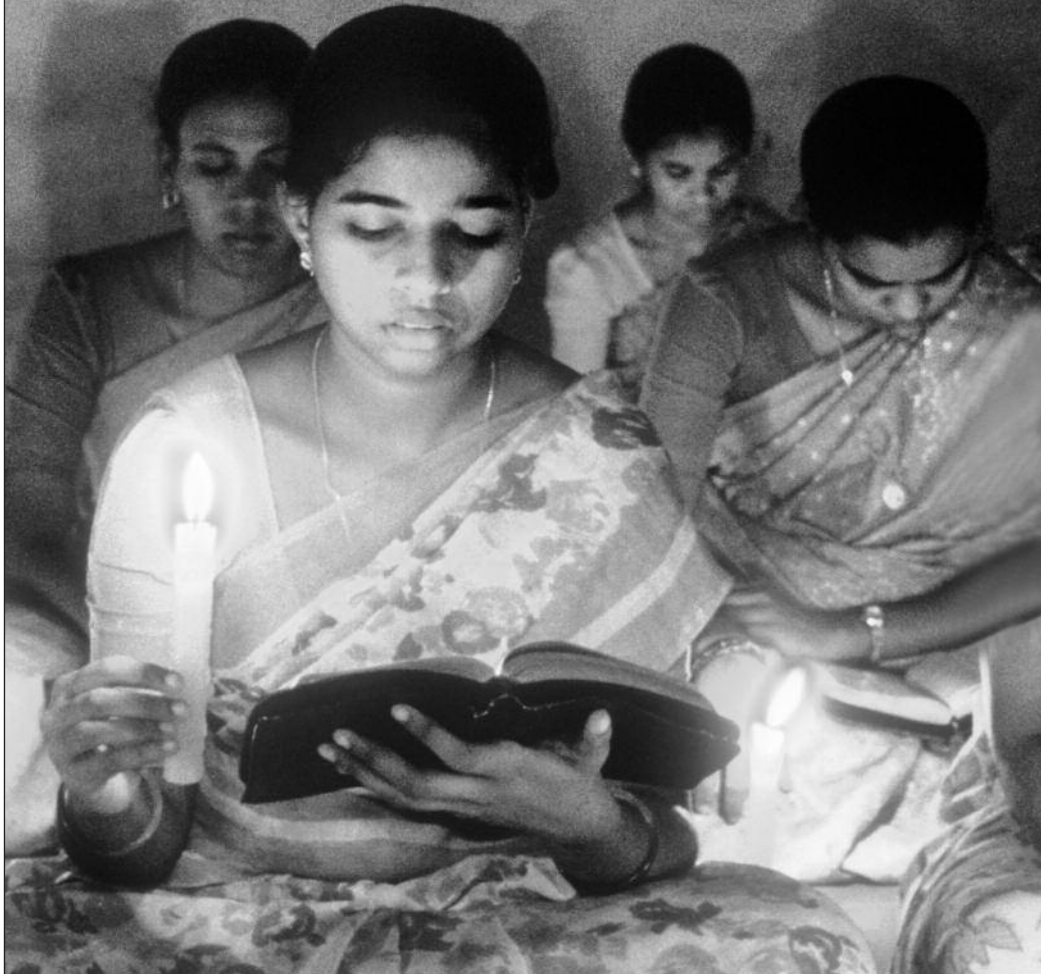

REFLECTION

Advent is a time of expectant watching in the darkest days of our northern year. We are waiting for the light of Christ to dawn. As these bible verses suggest, the coming of Christ will expose with sharp clarity the dark places of the world into which he comes – but will also wake us from sleep – like the sun bursting through our windows on a bright morning. As 'children of the light' we will be energised to respond to our world's deepest needs. Yet already a glimmer is breaking through the darkness: wherever the church seeks to bear witness in its life to 'all that is good and right and true'.

Scripture: Ephesians 5: 8-14

O Lord,
You have set before us the great hope
that your kingdom shall come on earth,
and have taught us to pray for its coming:
give us grace to discern
the signs of its dawning,
and to work for the perfect day
when your will shall be done on earth
as it is in heaven:

REFLECTION

It may seem strange that one of the most beloved of Advent readings – this celebration of the birth of the Prince of Peace – should originate from one of the darkest periods of Old Testament history. Isaiah 9 probably stems from the time when Israel was suffering savage military oppression at the hands of the Assyrian Empire. People were indeed living in 'a land of deep darkness'. Yet it is into this extreme darkness that the prophet Isaiah speaks – so sure of God's saving power that he can use the past tense: 'a child has been born for us'.

Scripture: Isaiah 9: 2, 6-7

PRAYER

God of tender compassion and mercy,
whose Son is the morning star
and the sun of righteousness:
let him shine in the darkness
and shadows of this world,
that we may serve you in freedom and peace;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

REFLECTION

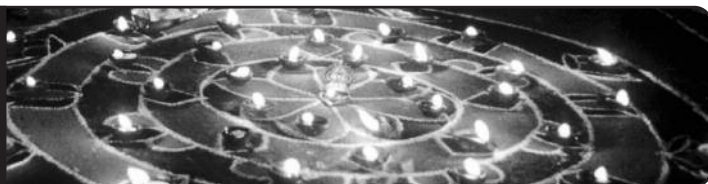
Matthew's vision of the church is like a city set on a hill whose light cannot be hid. That is both an exhilarating and frightening picture. The visibility of the church offers opportunity for witness and service. Yet visibility also means that a church's failings are apparent. John's Gospel tells us that Jesus said: 'I am the light of the world.' Matthew is here more daring still. 'You – Jesus' disciples – are the light of the world.' It is through us that the world will be able to glimpse something of Jesus. But if we fail to live up to our vocation then the responsibility for obscuring the light of Christ rests with us.

Scripture: Matthew 5: 14-16

PRAYER

Father of lights,
from whom comes every good and perfect gift:
keep us in the light of Christ,
to shine in your world,
that all may believe in you
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

WEEK 4

REFLECTION

1 Peter both explores and transforms Old Testament understandings of nation, temple and priesthood. Being built into a 'house' we are privileged to offer shelter to God, as well as to those who God stands alongside. To become 'a royal priesthood' is both an immense honour and an awesome challenge – for both priests and kings must live not for themselves alone but for others. So we have been pulled out of darkness to share God's marvellous light with others.

Scripture: 1 Peter 2: 4-5, 9-10

PRAYER

Kindle, O Lord, in our hearts, we pray,
the flame of that love which never ceases,
that it may burn in us and give light to others.
May we shine forever in your temple,
set on fire with that eternal light of yours,
which puts to flight the darkness of this world;
in the name of Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen**

REFLECTION

On Christmas Day we receive the greatest gift of all – God's gift of a new world, through the birth of the one who is the 'light of the world'. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians take us back to God's first words in Genesis: 'Let there be light.' From this beginning, Creation blazed into being. Since then the light may seem to have become dull and dim, but at Christmas time we are invited to discover just how brightly God's glory shines in the face of Jesus Christ. In this baby born in Bethlehem, creation's goal is at last accomplished. Let us celebrate – and help make God's new world a reality for our time.

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 4: 5-6

PRAYER

Holy Jesus,
to deliver us from the power of darkness
you humbled yourself to be born among us
and laid in a manger.
Let the light of your love always shine in our hearts,
and bring us at last to the joyful vision of your beauty;
for you are now alive and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit,
God forever and ever. **Amen**
