### The Annunciation: Luke 1:26-38

#### Bible notes

Nothing is impossible with God! Startling news is met with humility, and God's gift of his Son begins with a human response – Mary says 'yes', despite fear and lack of knowledge. The journey of faith begins with responding generously to the love of God in action. In the church of today, set in many different situations, God is at work and people are responding despite fears and often with little or no resources to even begin. What are we able to do in our situation to respond to the overwhelming and generous love of God? How do we say 'yes'? How do we help others say 'yes'?

#### Prayer

Almighty God, you looked on the meekness of Mary, the mother of our Lord, and inspired her to sing of that time when the hungry would be fed and the humble lifted high. Give us your Spirit's guidance that in following in Jesus' way, we may be humble and just for his dear name's sake. Amen.

### Responsory

### The Journey to Bethlehem: Luke 2:1-5

#### Bible notes

Luke gives us the background to this strange journey. Not only is Jesus' birth imminent, but difficulties are added by the need to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Journeys are so much a part of the life and ministry of Jesus, and this part of his story begins here. Today people are still called to leave behind the familiar and set out in God's service. From Paul's great missionary journeys to the present day, God is made known when people join in God's work wherever he may lead them. Along their journey, the Holy Family would have relied on others to meet their needs - food and shelter. How can we lift our eyes beyond our local church and community?

#### Prayer

Everlasting God, in every generation you raise up those who know the hope of the gospel in their hearts. Inspire us by your Spirit to show the light of Christ throughout the world. Give us, we pray, a bigger vision of your mighty purposes, and lift our eyes to look beyond our limited horizons to the world your Son Jesus came to save, for in his name we pray. Amen.

### Responsory

### No Room at the Inn: Luke 2:6-7

#### Bible notes

With the town full of visitors, Jesus is born with just the barest minimum of shelter. Some small compassion made this possible. It is extraordinary that the King of Kings finds no earthly home, and the Incarnate Lord sets out on his human life in circumstances so demeaning. The stable scene is so familiar – and so we can lose some of the impact from Luke's narrative. In a world of plenty, where some are in luxury, many have no home or are dispossessed or in extreme poverty. God's own generosity and justice are outraged! How can we be partners in God's new creation – the coming kingdom – where the hungry are fed and humble lifted high? How can we offer some small compassion to others who have so little?

#### Prayer

Almighty God, from you all thoughts of truth and peace proceed. Kindle in the hearts of all your people a true love of peace, and guide with your wisdom the leaders of all the nations on earth, so that your kingdom may come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

### The Birth of Christ: John 1:1-14

#### Bible notes

John's gospel gives no story of the birth of Jesus, but what we do have is this prologue which tells of the Word, the very being of God, expressed in the human life of Jesus, God's Son. It reads as a kind of reexpression of the story of the creation in Genesis 1. So we are told of the way in which God's light conquers all darkness, and human life is lifted up. Such dignity indeed! Yet many in God's creation are scarcely afforded the chance to live, let alone experience the opportunities of 'life in all its fullness'. How can we express in the things we do and say what we believe about the God who is Emmanuel – God with us – creatures of his image and worth? How can our actions make this a reality?

#### Prayer

Eternal God, you raised fallen humanity through the child-bearing of blessed Mary: as we have seen your glory revealed in our human nature and your love made perfect in our weakness, may we daily be renewed in your image and conformed to the pattern of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## The Adoration of the Shepherds: Luke 2:8-20

### Bible notes

The shepherds are the ordinary working folk, and their working day, or rather, night, is disrupted by the angel song. They are told of good news and not to be afraid. Those called to worship in today's world are sometimes set in circumstances where there is good cause to have fear. Those who share our humanity sometimes labour hard and long for very little reward. In our response to God's generosity, how can we help build a better world? How can we find the means of letting this heavenly song be heard, 'Glory to God in the highest heavens, and on earth peace among those whom he favours'?

### Prayer

Father of all, whose Son born among us was ruler over all things as Lord and King, bring all whom you have called to worship you in unity and peace. And bring all the created order to worship at his feet, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

### Bible notes

Their story has been retold through generations, echoing the mystery of truth told through word and action. The Christian vocation is to offer ourselves in God's service. As we follow the way Jesus taught, how can we - on life's journey - give light to generations yet to come? How can we reach out to others and help them find their way?

### Prayer

O God, you made yourself known by the leading of a star. Enlighten us with your truth, and raise up faithful witnesses, who by their life and teaching, may proclaim the truth of your salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
